

Prophecy of Christ

We will be taking a look at the prophecies of Christ in the Bible, these verses are being organized in such a way as to help us begin to see Jesus Christ in all of scripture and to see that His Word, both the Old and New Testament, is written by the same loving God not an angry (Old Testament) God and a forgiving (New Testament) God, but the same loving righteous God inspired the whole bible. God's word shows us who mankind is, who God is, and how God feels about us. An effort has been made to not use obscure references but the blatantly obvious ones, for example, I say that Jesus is in all of scripture and these are some verses that reflect that.

²⁶“Didn’t the Messiah have to suffer these things and enter into His glory?” ²⁷Then beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, He interpreted for them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures.” **Luke 24:26-27**

³⁷The Father who sent Me has Himself testified about Me. ³⁸You have not heard His voice at any time, and you haven’t seen His form. You don’t have His word living in you, because you don’t believe the One He sent. ³⁹You pore over the Scriptures because you think you have eternal life in them, yet they testify about Me. ⁴⁰And you are not willing to come to Me so that you may have life. **John 5:37-40**

⁴⁶For if you believed Moses, you would believe Me, because he wrote about Me. ⁴⁷But if you don’t believe his writings, how will you believe My words?” **John 5:46-47**

Before we begin I would like to state some ideas that will help this make sense to you. It is helpful to have similar points of reference for us to begin with so that these truths can be revealed. Being at least aware of these ideas if not accepting them will help give a vantage point from which we can see Jesus in all of scripture.

1. There are multiple levels of truth and significance in scripture like the rings of an onion or the spirals of a seashell.
2. The symbolic/spiritual truths in the bible do not detract from the fact that it happened in the physical world as well.
3. God as described in the Holy Bible, the Jewish/Christian bible is real and does exist in every detail as the bible describes.
4. Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, Imanuel (God with us).
5. The Bible is the Word of God, the ONLY True God and is THE Truth. As THE Truth it is not part story part fact. To accept some parts of the bible and to throw some away leaves too much room for a person to distort God’s Truth and live by what the individual thinks is true.
6. God is the Law giver, outside of man. God is completely pure, holy and good. He alone decides right and wrong, He alone is the rightful judge of all.
7. God is the creator of everything and in spite of that He cares about us collectively and individually.



Prophecy of Christ Fulfilled

First Coming

The bible is filled with prophecy which is important because it does give credibility to what is written. That may be one of the reasons why God chose around 40 different people to write the bible over a 1500 - 1600 year time period. The test of a prophet and to know that he has spoken a message from the Lord is simply that what is spoken comes true. The same can be used to test God's word.

²¹You may say to yourself, 'How can we recognize a message the Lord has not spoken?' ²²When a prophet speaks in the Lord's name, and the message does not come true or is not fulfilled, that is a message the Lord has not spoken. The prophet has spoken it presumptuously. Do not be afraid of him.' **Deuteronomy 18:21-22** (1400 BC)

¹⁹As for the prophet who prophesies peace — only when the word of the prophet comes true will the prophet be recognized as one the Lord has truly sent." ' **Jeremiah 28:9** (585 BC)

Using that standard the 35 prophecies listed here that Christ fulfilled are truly astounding. Please understand that this standard works to both validate the prophet and the prophecy when both are true. Before Jesus came the prophecies were unfulfilled leaving room for doubt about the prophets so not only do the prophets validate Jesus as the Christ, His first coming and fulfilling of the prophecies validates the prophets as well, showing the Holy Bible to be true and that truth is partially fulfilled in the first coming of our Lord Christ Jesus.

These verses will be arranged to show the old testament prophecy then the fulfillment of the prophecy by Jesus as Jesus came to fulfill the law and the prophets:

"Don't assume that I came to destroy the Law or the Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to fulfill. For I assure you: Until heaven and earth pass away, not the smallest letter or one stroke of a letter will pass from the law until all things are accomplished. ' Matthew 5:17-18

1. God's promise to Abraham that through him All of the world would be blessed!

When Abraham was first called by the Lord he was told that ALL families of the earth will be blessed through him and if it is believed that Jesus is the son of God and the savior of ALL mankind then that would certainly be a way that we would all be blessed through him. Jesus has given, through His righteous sacrifice, His complete obedience the right for ALL, Jew and Gentile, to be children of God.

²And I will make you a great nation, And I will bless you, And make your name great; And so you shall be a blessing; ³And I will bless those who bless you, And the one who curses you I will curse. And in you all the families of the earth will be blessed." ' **Genesis 12:2-3** (about 1900 years before Jesus)

¹⁸Abraham is to become a great and powerful nation, and all the nations of the earth will be blessed through him. ' **Genesis 18:18**

¹⁴Your offspring will be like the dust of the earth, and you will spread out toward the west, the east, the north, and the south. All the peoples on earth will be blessed through you and your offspring. ' **Genesis 28:14**

¹²But to all who did receive Him, He gave them the right to be children of God, to those who believe in His name, ¹³who were born, not of blood, or of the will of the flesh, or of the will of man, but of God. ' **John 1:12-13**

¹²⁵You are the sons of the prophets and of the covenant that God made with your ancestors, saying to Abraham, And all the families of the earth will be blessed through your offspring. ' **Acts 3:25**

¹⁸Now the Scripture saw in advance that God would justify the Gentiles by faith and told the good news ahead of time to Abraham, saying, All the nations will be blessed through you. ' **Galatians 3:8**

Jesus being born of a virgin is very required in hindsight. Only if the Messiah is born of a virgin could that child also be the son of God the Father. To further substantiate this concept is the Davidic lineage which is traced through Mary not Joseph. God likes to leave little doubt for those that seek Him and this can be seen by the curse of Jeconiah, alternatively spelled Jehoiakim or Coniah.

¹³⁰Thus says the Lord : “Write this man down as childless, a man who shall not succeed in his days, for none of his offspring shall succeed in sitting on the throne of David and ruling again in Judah.”
Jeremiah 22:30

As a result of Jeconiah’s curse by God the only way that Jesus the Messiah could be

- from the line of David in accordance with God’s covenant promise to David, 'Your house and kingdom will endure before Me forever, and your throne will be established forever.' ”

2 Samuel 7:16

- Born of God Imanuel meaning “God among us”

is to have His Davidic lineage traced through Mary. By the genealogies given in Matthew and Luke we know that Joseph’s biological father was Jacob and that Joseph was related to the Davidic line by virtue of his marriage to Mary making Joseph also the son of Heli.

'As He began His ministry, Jesus was about 30 years old and was thought to be the son of Joseph, son of Heli,' **Luke 3:23**

'and Jacob fathered Joseph the husband of Mary, who gave birth to Jesus who is called the Messiah.'
Matthew 1:16

2. The corner stone would be of Judah

“The cornerstone will come from Judah. The tent peg will come from them and also the battle bow and every ruler. Together” **Zechariah 10:4**

3. The Messiah would be born of a Virgin

Around 740 years before the birth of Jesus

¹³Isaiah said, “Listen, house of David! Is it not enough for you to try the patience of men? Will you also try the patience of my God? ¹⁴Therefore, the Lord Himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive, have a son, and name him Immanuel.” **Isaiah 7:13-14** (740 - 700 BC)

²²Now all this took place to fulfill what was spoken by the Lord through the prophet: ²³See, the virgin will become pregnant and give birth to a son, and they will name Him Immanuel, which is translated “God is with us.”” **Matthew 1:22-23**

²⁶In the sixth month, the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, ²⁷to a virgin engaged to a man named Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin’s name was Mary...

³²He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David.³³He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and His kingdom will have no end. ³⁴Mary asked the angel, “How can this be, since I have not been intimate with a man?” ³⁵The angel replied to her: “The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore, the holy One to be born will be called the Son of God.

4. The Messiah would be born in Bethlehem

Only someone that is God can be born from antiquity from eternity in the future.

²Bethlehem Ephrathah, you are small among the clans of Judah; One will come from you to be ruler over Israel for Me. His origin is from antiquity, from eternity.” **Micah 5:2** (800 BC)

⁵“In Bethlehem of Judea,” they told him, “because this is what was written by the prophet: ⁶And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the leaders of Judah: because out of you will come a leader who will shepherd My people Israel.”” **Matthew 2:5-6**

⁴And Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family line of David, ⁵to be registered along with Mary, who was engaged to him and was pregnant. ⁶While they were there, the time came for her to give birth. ' **Luke 2:4-6**

5. Kings would see what they had not been told

¹⁵so He will sprinkle many nations. Kings will shut their mouths because of Him, For they will see what had not been told them, and they will understand what they had not heard. '

Isaiah 52:15 (740 - 700 BC)

³When King Herod heard this, he was deeply disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. ⁴So he assembled all the chief priests and scribes of the people and asked them where the Messiah would be born. ⁵“In Bethlehem of Judea,” they told him, “because this is what was written by the prophet:'

6. God would call His Son out of Egypt

¹When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called My son.”

Hosea 11:1 (786–746BC)

¹⁵He stayed there until Herod’s death, so that what was spoken by the Lord through the prophet might be fulfilled: Out of Egypt I called My Son.” **Matthew 2:15**

7. Killing of the infants under the age of 2 around Bethlehem

“This is what the Lord says: A voice was heard in Ramah, a lament with bitter weeping — Rachel weeping for her children, refusing to be comforted for her children because they are no more.”

Jeremiah 31:15 (585 BC)

¹⁶Then Herod, when he saw that he had been outwitted by the wise men, flew into a rage. He gave orders to massacre all the male children in and around Bethlehem who were two years old and under, in keeping with the time he had learned from the wise men. ¹⁷Then what was spoken through Jeremiah the prophet was fulfilled: ¹⁸A voice was heard in Ramah, weeping, and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children; and she refused to be consoled, because they were no more. '

8. One will make His way straight

“¹See, I am going to send My messenger, and he will clear the way before Me. Then the Lord you seek will suddenly come to His temple, the Messenger of the covenant you desire — see, He is coming,” says the Lord of Hosts.” **Malachi 3:1** (700BC)

“³A voice of one crying out: Prepare the way of the Lord in the wilderness; make a straight highway for our God in the desert.” **Isaiah 40:3** (740 - 700 BC)

¹In those days John the Baptist came, preaching in the Wilderness of Judea ²and saying, “Repent, because the kingdom of heaven has come near!” ³For he is the one spoken of through the prophet Isaiah, who said: A voice of one crying out in the wilderness: Prepare the way for the Lord; make His paths straight! ' **Matthew 3:1-3**

⁴John came baptizing in the wilderness and preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were flocking to him, and they were baptized by him in the Jordan River as they confessed their sins. ' **Mark 1:4-5**

²during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, God's word came to John, the son of Zechariah in the wilderness. ³He went into all the vicinity of the Jordan, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, ⁴as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah: A voice of one crying out in the wilderness: Prepare the way for the Lord; make His paths straight!' **Luke 3:2-4**

9. First God will send Elijah

“¹² But I tell you: Elijah has already come, and they didn’t recognize him. On the contrary, they did whatever they pleased to him. In the same way the Son of Man is going to suffer at their hands.”

¹³Then the disciples understood that He spoke to them about John the Baptist.”

Matthew 17:12-13

¹¹ Then they began to question Him, “Why do the scribes say that Elijah must come first? ” “¹² Elijah does come first and restores everything,” He replied. “How then is it written about the Son of Man that He must suffer many things and be treated with contempt? ¹³ But I tell you that Elijah really has come, and they did whatever they pleased to him, just as it is written about him.” **Mark 9:11-13**

10. Proclamation of Jesus to Start His Ministry

He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, ²to proclaim liberty to the captives and freedom to the prisoners; to proclaim the year of the Lord’s favor, and the day of our God’s vengeance; to comfort all who mourn, **Isaiah 61:1-2** (740 - 700 BC)

¹⁶He came to Nazareth, where He had been brought up. As usual, He entered the synagogue on the Sabbath day and stood up to read. ¹⁷The scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to Him, and unrolling the scroll, He found the place where it was written: ¹⁸The Spirit of the Lord is on Me, because He has anointed Me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent Me to proclaim freedom to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set free the oppressed, ¹⁹to proclaim the year of the Lord’s favor.

²¹He began by saying to them, “**Today as you listen, this Scripture has been fulfilled.**” ’

Luke 4:16-19,21

11. Israel Requests an intercessor, I will raise up a Prophet

¹⁶This is what you requested from the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the assembly when you said, ‘Let us not continue to hear the voice of the Lord our God or see this great fire any longer, so

that we will not die! ' ¹⁷Then the Lord said to me, 'They have spoken well. ¹⁸I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their brothers. I will put My words in his mouth, and he will tell them everything I command him. ' **Deuteronomy 18:16-18** (1400 BC)

¹¹And the crowds kept saying, "This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee! "" **Matthew 21:11**

12. He will stay in the Galilee of the nations

¹Nevertheless, the gloom of the distressed land will not be like that of the former times when He humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali. But in the future He will bring honor to the Way of the Sea, to the land east of the Jordan, and to Galilee of the nations. ²The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; a light has dawned on those living in the land of darkness. ' **Isaiah 9:1-2** (740 - 700 BC)

¹⁴This was to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet Isaiah: ¹⁵Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali, along the sea road, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles! ¹⁶The people who live in darkness have seen a great light, and for those living in the shadowland of death, light has dawned. From then on Jesus began to preach, "**Repent, because the kingdom of heaven has come near!** "" **Matthew 4:14-17**

³²a light for revelation to the Gentiles and glory to Your people Israel. ' **Luke 2:32**

13. He bore our sickness

⁴Yet He Himself bore our sicknesses, and He carried our pains; but we in turn regarded Him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted.'

Isaiah 53:4 (740 - 700 BC)

¹⁷so that what was spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: He Himself took our weaknesses and carried our diseases. ' **Matthew 8:17**

²²But Jesus turned and saw her. "Have courage, daughter," He said. "Your faith has made you well." And the woman was made well from that moment. ' **Matthew 9:22**

He feels The Fathers power flow through Him

³⁰At once Jesus realized in Himself that power had gone out from Him. He turned around in the crowd and said, "Who touched My robes? " ' **Mark 5:30**

14. Response to John's disciples to verify He is the Messiah

¹⁸On that day the deaf will hear the words of a document, and out of a deep darkness the eyes of the blind will see. ¹⁹The humble will have joy after joy in the Lord , and the poor people will rejoice in the Holy One of Israel. ' **Isaiah 29:18-19** (740 - 700 BC)

³Then the eyes of those who see will not be closed, and the ears of those who hear will listen. ⁴The reckless mind will gain knowledge, and the stammering tongue will speak clearly and fluently.'

Isaiah 32:3-4 (740 - 700 BC)

⁵Then the eyes of the blind will be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped. '

Isaiah 35:5 (740 - 700 BC)

⁴Jesus replied to them, "Go and report to John what you hear and see: ⁵the blind see, the lame walk, those with skin diseases are healed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor are told the good news. ' **Matthew 11:4-5**

15. Jesus would not be heard in the street

“¹This is My Servant; I strengthen Him, this is My Chosen One; I delight in Him. I have put My Spirit on Him; He will bring justice to the nations. ²He will not cry out or shout or make His voice heard in the streets. ³He will not break a bruised reed, and He will not put out a smoldering wick; He will faithfully bring justice. ⁴He will not grow weak or be discouraged until He has established justice on earth. The islands will wait for His instruction.”’ **Isaiah 42:1-4** (740 - 700 BC)

“¹⁷so that what was spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: ¹⁸Here is My Servant whom I have chosen, My beloved in whom My soul delights; I will put My Spirit on Him, and He will proclaim justice to the nations. ¹⁹He will not argue or shout, and no one will hear His voice in the streets. ²⁰He will not break a bruised reed, and He will not put out a smoldering wick, until He has led justice to victory. ²¹The nations will put their hope in His name.” **Matthew 12:17-21**

16. Looking they do not see

“⁹And He replied: Go! Say to these people: Keep listening, but do not understand; keep looking, but do not perceive. ¹⁰Dull the minds of these people; deafen their ears and blind their eyes; otherwise they might see with their eyes and hear with their ears, understand with their minds, turn back, and be healed.” **Isaiah 6:9-10** (740 - 700 BC)

“¹⁴Isaiah’s prophecy is fulfilled in them, which says: You will listen and listen, yet never understand; and you will look and look, yet never perceive. ¹⁵For this people’s heart has grown callous; their ears are hard of hearing, and they have shut their eyes; otherwise they might see with their eyes and hear with their ears, understand with their hearts and turn back — and I would cure them.”

Matthew 13:14-15

¹¹He answered them, "The secret of the kingdom of God has been given to you, but to those outside, everything comes in parables ¹²so that they may look and look, yet not perceive; they may listen and listen, yet not understand; otherwise, they might turn back — and be forgiven." ' **Mark 4:11-12**

' **John 12:37,39-40,42-43**

17. Triumphant entry

⁹Rejoice greatly, Daughter Zion! Shout in triumph, Daughter Jerusalem! Look, your King is coming to you; He is righteous and victorious, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey." **Zechariah 9:9** (640 - 620 BC)

¹⁴On that day His feet will stand on the Mount of Olives, which faces Jerusalem on the east. The Mount of Olives will be split in half from east to west, forming a huge valley, so that half the mountain will move to the north and half to the south. ' **Zechariah 14:4** (640 - 620 BC)

¹⁵Then they brought it to Jesus, and after throwing their robes on the donkey, they helped Jesus get on it. ³⁶As He was going along, they were spreading their robes on the road... ³⁹Some of the Pharisees from the crowd told Him, "Teacher, rebuke Your disciples." **Luke 19:35-36,39**

⁶The disciples went and did just as Jesus directed them. ⁷They brought the donkey and the colt; then they laid their robes on them, and He sat on them." **Matthew 21:6-7**

⁹Then the crowds who went ahead of Him and those who followed kept shouting: Hosanna to the Son of David! He who comes in the name of the Lord is the blessed One! Hosanna in the highest heaven! ¹⁰When He entered Jerusalem, the whole city was shaken, saying, "Who is this? "" **Matthew 21:9-10**

¹⁶and said to Him, "Do You hear what these children are saying? " "Yes," Jesus told them. "Have you never read: You have prepared praise from the mouths of children and nursing infants? "" **Matthew 21:16**

19. The stone that is rejected
